by february 2023, by vote of the ACAV Governing Body, I have taken over the presidency of the Association, of which I have been a member since 2019. This is my first opportunity to introduce myself to you and to publicly thank all the members of the Governing Body for the trust placed in me. I owe special gratitude to Giorgio Boneccher, who preceded me in office, for his immediate willingness to continue to follow and take care of our Association's accounting and balance sheet, thus confirming his indispensable contribution.

The balance sheet presents a modest and contained loss that is well absorbed by the reserves made over the positive years, but it also presents an alarm bell that we, as the Governing Body, are taking into account and monitoring in order to better manage 2023. Employees in Italy are also active in this direction. ACAV has been going through a critical period in the last three years due to, but not limited to, the shrinking contributions and funding from the Autonomous Province of Trento in support of international cooperation, and the reduction of European ones as well. Similarly, the pandemic and the war in Ukraine have created a shift from solidarity in general towards Africa to closer issues.

My intention and promise to all of you supporting ACAV is to carry on, with the help and cooperation of the Governing Body, Vice President Laura Strada, Trento office supervisor Angela Coslop and above all the Head and Country Director in Uganda Pierluigi Floretta, the projects for the essential improvement of living conditions in the West Nile region of Uganda and the refugees from the war in South Sudan.

In order to be able to proceed, your generosity in donations will become increasingly important. Many are significant and have allowed the rehabilitation of boreholes that are now giving many communities the basic good of drinking water again. I therefore ask you now, more than in the past, within the limits of your possibilities, to support ACAV also with your 5xMille to allow our association to overcome these difficult years and successfully continue the projects that it has carried out in these 35 years of activity.


AGRICULTURE AND FORESTRY



ACAV is registered in the list of ONLUS organisations kept by the Trento Revenue Agency.

ACAV operates exclusively in Uganda (mainly in Rhino Camp) while keeping an eye on the geopolitical situation in neighbouring countries, Congo and South Sudan.



ACAV adapts its statute to the reform of the Third Sector in order to acquire, after registration in the Single National Register of the Third Sector within the legal deadline, recognition as a Third Sector Entity.

ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE

ACAV is administered by a Governing Body whose members are elected every three years by the Shareholders' Assembly. The Governing Body prepares the general operational programmes that it submits to the Assembly and decides on the day-to-day management of the NGO. 

With this project, ACAV improved the water and hygiene situation of refugees and host communities in the Obongi District, which were at risk due to the total absence of installations and nearby water access points. Through the rehabilitation of 15 non-functioning boreholes, the availability of clean water was increased, also preventing the spread of the Corona Virus.

In addition to the rehabilitation of 15 boreholes, the project also included an information awareness-raisina and process for the beneficiary communities and formation of management committees for the rehabilitated water sources.





With the aim of preventing and reducing the spread of the SARS-CoV-19 pandemic, ACAV, together with the Koboko and Maracha Districts, rehabilitated 2O non-functioning water sources distributed between the two districts, ensuring clean water for the population.

Twenty management committees formed by people from the community have been created, empowering the beneficiaries and allowing good care over time, thus ensuring the sustainability of what has been achieved.

In addition, ACAV raised awareness among the beneficiary communities on the importance of the proper use of the new water source and the correct hygiene and sanitation behaviour to prevent the spread of water-related diseases.

Information and awareness-raising courses on good hygiene practices

Donor: **Autonomous Province of Trento** (€80.000)



This project aimed to improve access to clean water for South Sudanese refugees in Rhino Camp and the host community in order to reduce the spread of SARS-CoV-19.

Between January and May 2022, the project rehabilitated 15 non-functioning water sources and provided support to four local schools on proper boreholes management and infection prevention.

In addition, disinfectant gel, awareness posters and tanks were provided to reduce the risk of gatherings front in of boreholes.

Water management committees were set up to the ensure proper management of the water sources over time.



AGRICULTURE

ACAV promotes and implements rural development projects to train farmers in agriculture and forestry. It provides help and technical support for the adoption of the most efficient and productive cultivation methods to allow farmers to solve the problem of food for their daily needs and also to produce for the local market. In addition, ACAV promotes the use of selected and improved seeds and also provides assistance and kits for post-harvest management.



This project is a continuation of an earlier successful project, aiming to strengthen the resilience of refugees and host communities in the Rhino Camp area by improving livelihoods and food security through the provision of high quality planting materials and training on agronomic aspects.

450 farmers received training, cassava cuttings, seeds selected from sesame, groundnut, maize and sorghum, and technical assistance in the field. In addition, the project focused on conflict prevention between host communities and refugees and the integration of long-term refugees into the host community.

This development project, financed by the World Food Programme and implemented by ACAV, improved the economic participation of smallholder farmers and business owners, with a focus on youth, women and refugees, by increasing their agricultural capacity and incomes.

ACAV raised awareness and provided training on post-harvest management systems and collective marketing of agricultural products, also distributing equipment and introducing a WhatsApp group to facilitate contacts between traders and farmer groups.

In addition, specific trainings on food safety and horticultural production were provided to members of the Koboko Traders' Association and young people from the Jabara Agricultural and Vocational Institute, followed by the distribution of farm starter kits and basic equipment.





EDUCATION

ACAV organises vocational training and business start-up courses and provides its beneficiaries with a kit with working tools and instruments.

ACAV is also involved in building schools and training local teachers.

Started at the end of November 2022, this project aims to professionally train 20 refugee girls to promote their integration into the labour market. The aim is to reduce the negative effects of poverty, unemployment and youth marginalisation by strengthening economic and social resilience, while also limiting the lack of social protection caused by the long closure of schools due to the pandemic.

The project included 75 days of theoretical and practical training and the introduction of 60 days of apprenticeship in artisanal centres to put the skills acquired in the classroom into practice.

At the end there will be a qualifying examination, delivery of the certificate and of kits of tools and utensils useful for starting work for beneficiaries the who have completed the course.

ACAV, with the support of the San Zeno Foundation, built the school of Amuru, investing in the primary education and technical training of vulnerable children from South Sudan or from the Ugandan host community.

The project, which is an extension of the first AFRICARE, has contributed to improving the living conditions of the younger population within the Rhino Camp refugee camp, ensuring quality education for children.

15O young people between the ages of 14 and 19 benefited from the vocational training by receiving, after a period of apprenticeship at a specific artisanal business, a tool kit necessary to start their own business. After the training, many young people emigrated to urban centres in search of work or by starting their own business, becoming able to support themselves and their families with basic needs.

ACAV and its partners completed the registration of the school in Amuru, involving the Terego District Education Department and the Ugandan Ministry of Education, officially bringing it into the Ugandan public school system. UNHCR assumed the burden of all expenses necessary for its operation until the majority of refugee pupils return to their country of origin.



GOVERNANCE & LOCAL DEVELOPMENT

ACAV provides technical support to strengthen and implement local governance and development in Uganda.

The project is part of an action plan funded by the European Union Trust Fund for Africa (EUTF) whose aim is to contribute to the implementation of the Comprehensive Refugee Response Framework (CRRF) in the Horn of Africa.

The EUTF action plan noted that by supporting local municipalities in improving urban planning, service delivery and the creation of spaces for dialogue between different social groups, they could consequently improve opportunities and living conditions for refugees and host communities, thus reducing the risk of rivalry and conflict in favour of a climate of greater well-being and security.

In Uganda, the EUTF action plan targets the Koboko municipality, which faces numerous challenges, such as insufficient health services, water shortages, overcrowding in schools, housing shortages, etc.

This project therefore aims to improve the capacity of the Koboko municipality to provide services inclusive in an participatory manner. ACAV, therefore, offers provide Koboko assistance to technical municipality with the tools to strengthen its urban planning and service delivery capacities for the welfare and integration of refugees and host communities.



Between November 2021 and June 2022, ACAV and GVT, the project leader, met with pupils from a number of Trento's primary and middle schools, presenting them with three different paths, each focusing on a specific Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) contained in the UN's 2030 Agenda:

- Zero Hunger (SDG2): theme of the right to food for families and students worldwide, family farming and ACAV and GTV's projects on these issues;
- Quality Education (SDG 4): theme of the right to education, talking about GTV and ACAV projects in support of schools located in refugee camps or remote areas;
- Water and Sanitation for All (SDG 6): topic on access. protection and conflicts over water hoarding, reporting on creatina projects maintaining boreholes and toilets in Uganda and Vietnam. This SDG was the focus of the two concluding moments with the pupils as authors and actors "La Ciclomolecola", theatrical performance on the water cycle which in testimony by Nadia, a child beneficiary of an ACAV water project, was read.





This project, started in 2018, aims to grow among children a commitment to the culture of solidarity and the value of reciprocity, and to raise awareness and responsibility in their daily actions on the topics proposed and addressed.

In particular, involving pupils, families, teachers and the school community as a whole, they reflected on and discussed issues related to the United Nations 2030 Agenda. Together with the Canossian Kindergarten and Centromoda Canossa, ACAV had the opportunity to promote a transversal didactics of Global Citizenship Education and deepen the themes concerning three Goals: SDG 6 (clean water), SDG 15 (life on Earth) and SDG 16 (peace, justice and sound institutions).

With regard to the last two SDGs 15 and 16, the activities carried out are illustrated in the books "Leaflet Green" and "Together in Search of Possible Citizenships", published in autumn 2022.






